Don't Forget Your Bus Pass for free bus travel

Pupils eligible for free bus travel under the Young Persons' Free Bus Travel Scheme **must** present a valid/working National Entitlement Card (bus pass) when travelling.

Every journey made *must* be recorded so that the Scottish Government can pay bus operators. Tapping your pass when you board the bus each time you travel makes this possible.

If you cannot present a valid pass or alternative means of payment, the driver can refuse travel.

To help make your journeys to school easy and stress free, please follow these top tips:





Always tap your pass when you board the bus. This includes the bus to school!



Have a back-up bus fare and keep it in a safe place in your school bag, or a separate section in a purse or wallet, so you've always got it handy.



If your pass is faulty, damaged, or lost, you will be required to pay using an alternative method (e.g. contactless card/device or cash fare).



Parents/carers should ensure their child can pay the fare if their bus pass is not accepted - please make sure they have access to an alternative payment
